ICA Group reported that the creative director of NCS Colour, Karl Johan Bertilsson, presented the 2024+ color trends while underlining the importance of contrasts for vision. Color can spark passion and wellbeing, and even the slightest chromatic difference can have an enormous impact. The palette of 24 colors for Interior Colour Trends 2024+ has already been formulated by NCS's color specialists.

The group of trend experts has identified four trends, the main aspects of which include a preference for more chromatic colors, the strong presence of dark shades and the desire for natural nuances. It will be a year of action and evasion, with a strong desire to return to nature.


The colors in these four trends have been formulated by ICA color specialists for the design of surfaces and materials. They are also included in the ICA Color tintometric system.



Young Folk

The first trend, rich in color contrasts, represents the digital natives generation

who live between the physical world and the metaverse, so they need pure and cheerful colors, which are present in both environments. Pink is becoming increasingly popular in interior design, green evokes the vitality of nature, while yellow is used in a more innovative way with greener shades as opposed to red.



Wood Kick

The second trend denotes the desire to live in harmony with nature and to evade

from virtual reality. This trend also emerged in the interior design proposals seen at the Salone del Mobile 2023 trade fair, where natural effects and earth tones featured prominently. The highly matte orange combines with two dark green and brown shades and pastel shades.



Heart / Stop

Red symbolizes the stop but also love and hope. This trend denotes a desire to

stop what's not going well and to make happen what we desire. Red is combined with contrasting blue and a neutral shade.



Star Gazer

This color trend is characterized by the use of powerful colors that

evoke spirituality, but also luxury. Identity and feelings become fluid and changeable, the concept of gender is completely redefined and ethnic and geographic differences lose importance. Purple, a symbol of wealth and good fortune, becomes pivotal in this trend, mixing perfectly with gold.

Kitchen Design Trends From NKBA & House Beautiful

House Beautiful worked with designers and the National Kitchen & Bath Association to publish its annual kitchen design trends. The trend watchers say these aesthetic ideas have staying power. Expect them to be strong for the next few years.



Communal Seating Arrangements Skip bar-style seating at your kitchen island. "Conversational islands are definitely back versus looking at the cook doing all the work or feeding you island-side," says Carisha Swanson, director of editorial special projects at House Beautiful.

Combination Islands

According to Anastasia Casey of IDCO Studio, we'll get the best of both worlds in 2024 when it comes to kitchen islands. "We'll see way more combination islands in the kitchen. This means that 50 to 60 percent of the island will have closed storage below, while the remaining 40 to 50 percent will have simple furniture-style legs with large top drawers and open space below for counter-height stools to tuck under," she says.

Gold Hardware

The NKBA found that matte black will take second place as homeowners go for gold. Kitchen sink faucets in matte, satin, and brushed finishes will be gleaming in gold to create a warmer atmosphere.



A Blend of Materials

"We'll also be seeing the continuation of wood tones in kitchens, with the combination of wood and painted cabinetry in more innovative ways," says Casey. For example, 2024 will bring cabinet towers in stained wood with lower cabinets in a painted finish.

Elevated Coffee Breaks

Homeowners are looking to install beverage stations in their kitchens in 2024. This upgrade includes coffee bars with built-in coffee makers, wet bars, and smoothie stations with room to store glassware in the cabinets.

Warm Woods

The NKBA and Swanson are looking forward to welcoming warm natural wood tones back into kitchens. The trend of coating cabinets in white is taking a backseat! Natural high texture and wood patterns on cabinets bring an organic air to kitchens, especially when they're part of a contemporary, midcentury, or Scandinavian design.

Based in part on a survey of more than 1,200 interior design industry experts, MasterBrand Cabinets revealed its take on trends that will influence designers in 2024. What is the largest cabinet manufacturer in North America banking on to be popular? Let's find out.

Slower-Paced Living

People are looking to preserve some of the slower pace of living learned during the pandemic, and ongoing self-care is now viewed as essential for mental preservation and peace. 45% percent of those surveyed are spending more time than ever in their kitchens, which is taking center stage as a hub of relaxation and connection and driving the design decisions we're making.

Simple Yet Versatile Colors and Finishes
Light tone wood finishes, whites and off-whites are on
the rise, including bleached-out natural woods and white
oak with a light or natural tone. According to Houzz, 40%
of renovated kitchens feature white cabinets and 46% of
homeowners are also opting for color mixing in the kitchen.
Most often, they are choosing a contrasting island cabinet
color with the most popular choices being blue, gray, black
and warm brown tones.

Raw, Organic and Warm

Emerging color trends also include a notable rise of boldly soft colors and raw, organic and warm shades. A transition from vivid reds to warmer, orange-based reds brings an earthy boldness to interior spaces. Hues of warm orange-reds are showing up on walls, furnishings

and décor, adding depth and character to interiors and providing a visual focal point that effortlessly draws the eye in and sparks interest without taking away from a neutral, earthy space.

Top Kitchen Styles and Emerging Influences
Transitional, soft modern and modern traditional are
the top three trending kitchen styles, with homeowners
and designers blending design elements to balance
aesthetics, functionality and personal flair in kitchens.
The result is both modernity and timeless elegance,
including curved edges and arches becoming increasingly
popular in home design.

Simplifying for Functionality and Universal Storage

Eighty-three percent of designers surveyed noted kitchen islands have replaced traditional dining tables. Multifunctional islands with optimal storage allow for a clutter-free and well-organized space to be used as a gathering place, workstation and serving area. With the rise of open shelving, there is also a need to offset the reduction in kitchen storage space, leading to an increase in the use of working butler's pantries and large walk-in pantries as space allows.
